Jesus also said in John 16 that we may have "peace in Him" and to "be of good cheer, for I have overcome the world". Inwardly, they are looking for a light. Jesus is the light that they need to see, and we who have received Him, are the ones that He has called to reflect His light.

A Note from Nicky Ubert - Children's Minister

How many of us have participated in a White Elephant Christmas gift exchange, or something similar, where you can choose a gift from a pile (or take someone else's)? How do you choose which gift to take? Do you go for the biggest, the smallest, or the best wrapped? Do you try to figure it out by analyzing the look of the package, the feel or the noise it might make?

This season I've been thinking about the physical present we might give someone. Often I'm excited to buy a gift for someone and I know exactly what I want to give them, other times the act of shopping can



be a chore or a burden for a variety of reasons. Although it can be wonderful to bless someone with a physical gift, a simple act that can bring JOY to both the receiver and giver, we have an opportunity of greater importance to impart a more lasting gift.

What if you could give that gift to someone that truly never ends? Who wouldn't want to do that and who wouldn't want to choose that gift!?!?! The only gift that can last forever is a life that has eternal hope through the sacrifice Jesus made at the cross for every one of us. It can be difficult to share that gospel message, even though we are all called to, with friends and family and although we might share, the decision of acceptance really isn't up to us.

There is, however; another powerful gift we can give someone – *PRAYER*! Prayer is a gift in and of itself that draws us into a closer relationship with God. What if we took the opportunity to pray over each and everyone one of those physical gifts we give!! Have you ever done that? Speaking to myself here!!! I can honestly say I don't think I have intentionally prayed over a gift I gave someone. Now I don't mean praying for the gift specifically but rather with the person in mind on the receiving end. What if we took that gift and intentionally prayed specifics things for that person and maybe even took it a step further and journaled those specific prayer requests. We could see how God is moving in their life (and ours) maybe through those very prayers. Prayer is a powerful gift and the act has eternal impacts. There is opportunity to teach our kids, during a much commercialized season, the "real value" in giving a gift, covered in prayer. Make it a family tradition and assign a gift/name to each family member and help them create a list of things they could commit to praying for. The prayer could be for a period of time or as long as necessary. If you have younger children keep the list simple but if your children are older challenge them to think it through and be thoughtful. It's easy to get caught up in the season of Christmas (decorating, shopping, busyness...etc.) but intentionally creating family traditions through it helps us apply correct focus on Christ and will benefit everyone (eternally).

I love Christmas; the sights, the smells, the feelings it evokes. Perhaps instead of it being something that we take out when we "set up Christmas" and then put away when done, the continued intentional prayers for those we gave gifts to will help keep the real feelings and purposes of Christmas with us much longer.

I want to thank everyone at Country Faith Church for the love and support you continuously show our family. I am blessed to work for, and alongside, wonderful people. It is an honor to serve in the children's ministry program at CFC. I *pray* your holiday season will be filled with Joy, Peace, and Hope in Christ.

Mustard Seed Homes Application Excerpts

We have had hundreds of applications to Mustard Seed Homes over the years. Most have come from homes broken by divorce, drugs, or even death. Many have mental health issues; Fetal Alcohol Syndrome, anxiety, depression, and substance abuse are the norm. Common alcohol and drug treatment programs only begin to scratch the surface of much larger wounds that these men bear. Most have not had a healthy parent role model, and fathers are rarely in the picture. This epidemic will only grow in the days ahead. As most of you can attest, this journey is no quick trip around the block. It takes time to go the distance. Grace and mercy trump the work the thief has done, but unfortunately, building trust takes time. These men need to learn to trust God and the people whom He puts in their lives. As you read through these, ask the Holy Spirit what you can do to help change the course of these lives!

Jesus said, "THE SPIRIT OF THE LORD IS UPON ME (the Messiah) BECAUSE HE HAS ANOINTED ME TO PREACH GOOD NEWS TO THE POOR."

Excerpt #1: I am 21. Both my biological parents were addicted to drugs and alcohol. My mom drank while she was pregnant with all of her kids. At the age of four, I was adopted by my auntie and uncle. I spent the next twelve years living with them and where I started going to church. I am Baptist. We would go to church every Sunday and sometimes Wednesday. I grew up reading the Bible. My mom wouldn't let us do a lot because it went against what the Bible said. Any way I left the home when I was sixteen due to abuse. I would stay with friends till I would get caught then go to juvie, then to foster homes. I would then run away from these homes till I was eighteen. Then I was really on my own. I started drinking and doing drugs. Also I would sleep with different women just so I would have a place to stay. I started to steal just to get by, and if I could get one I would have different jobs. I first got in trouble with the Iaw with a first degree burglary charge, credit card fraud and criminal sexual conduct all at the same time. After that it was all drinking charges. I went to prison and have one year and six months in. I really do want to change and start over.

Jesus went on to say: "HE HAS SENT ME TO ANNOUNCE RELEASE (pardon, forgiveness) TO THE CAPTIVES,"

Excerpt #2: I am 20. My father abused and neglected me until I was 4 years old, so I don't remember it today. I was adopted by my grandmother. Bullied throughout school I turned to music for strength. I listen to artists that have and are going through the same things I have. I have been emotionally abused by the girls I have dated and been close to. I've been used for every material and emotional service I could provide. Faith is not a big part of my life, it's more spirituality. For two years leading up to July 3rd of this year, I used drugs heavily, starting with marijuana and leading to prescription pills and LSD. I overdosed one day, and the next day I wanted more. Not wanting my life controlled by drugs, I attempted suicide by over dosing on trazadone. I was put in inpatient mental health for seven days until I admitted to a petition for commitment. I was then sent to inpatient treatment at Glenmore and have stayed clean since.

"AND RECOVERY OF SIGHT TO THE BLIND"

Excerpt #3: I am 35. My life has been a rollercoaster since age 14 in and out of jails, treatments, and prison, both as a juvenile and an adult. I've been high on drugs or drunk on beer or liquor my whole adult life, only sober when locked up. Somehow, I've always had a job; I had to to stay high. I worked to play you could say. I went to prison in 2004-06. I had two beautiful children, but I still never sobered up. I would always try to sober up for someone else - courts, probation, a girlfriend, or family, but never for myself. It has been about a year now that I truly, truly want to be clean. I want to for me. I am tired of this life that I've been living - tired of excuses after excuses to my children. Why am I in jail again? I'm at my wits end and looking for help! I've found God. I want to work on my faith, my addiction, and to become the person/father I can be. I'd like to one day have the ability to help people that struggle with drugs.

Jesus came "TO SET FREE THOSE WHO ARE OPPRESSED (downtrodden, bruised, crushed by tragedy)." Luke 4:18 AMP.

Quinten's Fingers - By Luke Lundell

As many of you have probably heard, my son Quinten had an accident involving his fingers back in the middle of October. My wife and I were down in the cities for the weekend, and our kids were staying with my brother and sister-in-law in Bemidji. The accident happened after church. Quinten had gotten his pinkie and ring finger of his left hand smashed between a door jamb and a loading ramp. His pinkie was nearly cut off and his ring finger was damaged pretty bad as well. It was severe enough that he was flown to the cities to a level 1 trauma hospital to have surgery on his fingers. A plastic surgeon performed the surgery of attaching tendons, and realigning bones, putting a pin in his pinkie finger, etc. He did the surgery, and we were able to leave the hospital that same night. Praise God, it all went well and a month later, he is healing excellent.

Through this scary event, we were able to experience some amazing things. I'd like to expound on three of them:

- The power of prayer and being obedient to the nudges from the Holy Spirit when he prompts you to pray for somebody.
- The power of Biblical preaching and how God orchestrates His will in all things.
- The power of the body of Christ, His church.

It wasn't until a week after the accident, did we find out that while at church the Sunday of the accident, a gentleman was compelled to pray for Quinten. Little did he know what to pray for or why, but he just started praying for him. Now, I can't say that if he didn't obey the Holy Spirit's prompting to pray for Quinten that the accident would have been worse or had a different outcome. But I can say that by obeying the Holy Spirit, the man's faith was greatly strengthened. And by sharing the story with others, it is of great encouragement, to me at least, to obey those promptings from the Holy Spirit to pray for someone who He puts on your heart. Even when you don't know why. The man had no idea what was going to happen just hours later with my son. But he was obedient and prayed, and his faith and others was strengthened because of it!



We also were able to experience the sovereignty of God and the power of preaching. As I said earlier, we were in the cities for the weekend. We were with another couple who used to live there and we had the privilege of attending the church that they used to go to. The sermon preached that morning was excellent! And little did we know that only a few hours later would we be experiencing the main points of the sermon. The Pastor was preaching through the book of John, and the Sunday we were there, he preached out of chapter 11, the death of Lazarus. At the end of the sermon, he gave us all an exercise. We were to-

- 1. Write down our two, maybe three, most difficult things going on in our life.
- 2. We were asked to pray, think, and write down how Jesus might glorify himself through our difficult circumstances.
- 3. We were to pray, think, and write down how our faith and others will be strengthened through our difficulties.
- 4. And finally, we were asked to give thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. (Ephesians 5:20)

We definitely were able to apply and experience them later on that day! God is so amazing, how he orchestrates everything. I believe God ordained that specific text to be preached in advance to prepare us for what we were going to experience just a few hours later. He is in control of ALL things! It definitely was a very difficult circumstance for us. From not knowing what was happening in all the confusion, to being 4 hours away from our son when he was in pain, to not knowing what might happen to his fingers. We had time to meditate on how Jesus would be glorified through this whole incident. We had time to pray and ask God the Father to strengthen our faith and others as well. And we were able to experience Philippians 4:6-7- "do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your

minds in Christ Jesus." God is worthy to be praised in ALL circumstances, no matter the outcome. And to be in His presence during a scary time is so very comforting.

Another, and the most powerful experience we had through it all, was experiencing the body of Christ in a mighty way. What I mean is that we were able to experience the church in a tangible way. The calls and texts of encouragement were overwhelming. By the time we finally found out that Quinten was going to be flown to North Memorial Hospital in Robbinsdale, we were already to St. Cloud on our way home. So we turned around and rushed to the hospital. As word spread about what had happened to our son, the calls and texts flooded in. It was by far the most emotional part of the whole event. The love from our brothers and sisters in Christ was overwhelming. And what made it even greater was that it wasn't just our loving body of believers at Country Faith greatly encouraging us, but it was also our Bible study group in Fosston offering support and prayers, our family members, and even brothers and sisters in Christ that we had met just days earlier, offering their homes if we needed a place to stay and to help anyway they could. God is so good! He set up His church for many reasons, and we were able to taste just a little bit of His glory through His church!

As I write this we have boxes on their way to South Africa and others are still awaiting shipment from the Minneapolis processing center. What Will 2018 look like for the Women of CFC?

We are still in the planning stages for 2018 but I will tell you what I know.

Jan/Feb/March - Women's Bible Studies will begin in January. Watch the church bulletin and check out the Women's Ministry Cart for more information. We will be offering 2 very different opportunities for <u>Friday am</u> as follows:

- 1. Women's fellowship coffee/discussion time on current life issues. Day care will be provided for your little one. April Gazelka will host/lead this time. The focus will be getting together as women to talk about the challenges they face, learn from others and seek direction from the Lord in a relaxed warm setting. Your time together may include a short devotional or a fitting video clip. You will need to come join the group to see what all will happen! I know there will also be a variety of expresso coffees to be tasted and savored. There will be no homework with this class \mathbb{R} !
- 2. Different women have expressed to me the desire to really be able to study the Word of God. They want to dig into the Scriptures and understand them by truly doing the with themselves. We are looking at offering this type of study by Jen Wilkin on the <u>Sermon on the Mount</u> studying Matthew 5,6 and 7 for 11 weeks. I am including a quote by Rachael Starke which describes the why and the what for including this type of study at CFC......... "The landscape of women's Bible study writers and teachers has expanded significantly beyond Kay Arthur and Beth Moore in the past several years. Today, books and Bible studies by Priscilla Shirer, Lysa TerKeurst, Christine Caine and others occupy prime shelf space in Christian bookstores, and are frequent go-to choices for womens' small group Bible studies. Many reasons for this growth are understandable. All of these women are



articulate, engaging, fluent in the language of the Bible, and passionate about helping women grow in their understanding of Scripture and their relationship with the One it reveals. The study materials they publish are polished and thoughtfully constructed to keep women engaged and motivated in their study. But other commonalities, specifically, a hermeneutical approach that places women and personal circumstances at the heart of the story of Scripture, has popularized an approach to the understanding and appropriation of God's Word that can be overly therapeutic and sentimental. This approach potentially sells women short in their understanding of who God is and how the gospel is good news only when He is at its center, instead of them.

Wilkin's inaugural study on the Sermon on the Mount (published jointly by Lifeway and The Gospel Coalition) is essentially a practical application of the principles she covers in her bestselling book, Women of the Word (published by Crossway). Its format follows the one that has been the foundation for the interdenominational study she leads in Flower Mound, Texas, attended each week by over 600 women, and heard by several thousands more online. Each week's lesson is comprised of five days of homework intended to raise questions, small group discussion topics to help wrestle with questions, and a 25 minute video-based teaching time designed to resolve questions. In each week's lesson, Wilkin works to center our study of Jesus' most famous sermon in the context of the rest of Scripture. Her questions on each passage focus on three critical areas: what the passage says, what it means, and how it should change us. Change will flow from what a passage reveals about God's character, how that revelation shapes our view of our self, and our necessary response. In her introductory comments, Wilkin encourages us to set aside our go-to commentaries or even study Bible notes and to "dwell in the I don't know" as we wrestle with text directly. As an aid in this, the back section of the study contains a widely-spaced printing of the entire passage where you are encouraged to make notes and circle or highlight thematically pertinent words and phrases as the study progresses."

<u>Evening women's Bible Study?</u> We will possibly be offering an evening women's Bible Study in late March and April. If you are interested in such a study, please talk to Stacy or myself.

We are currently developing an expanded women's vision planning team at CFC so there will be more to come in 2018. Stacy and I are personally very excited about the plans God has for women at CFC! My heart is also very thankful for the women of our church who have hearts to serve each other and serve our Lord Jesus Christ. You women are bright lights shining in a dark world pointing with your lives to Jesus who has redeemed us and brought us into His wonderful glorious kingdom!
